

The "Master Composters" Scheme

Garden Organic, in collaboration with the UK's County Councils' waste minimization teams support over 500 Master Composters in counties across the UK.

Many of you compost and know that making and using compost is the cornerstone of good gardening. Compost is made of recycled garden and kitchen waste, and can also include paper / card products. It is used to feed and condition the soil and in making potting mixes. An astonishing **c40** percent of the average dustbin contents are suitable for home composting so composting helps cut down on landfill too.

Making compost is often considered to be complex but all you need to do is provide the right ingredients and let nature do the rest - however, a little know-how will help you make better compost, more efficiently.

Two directors of Bisley Community Composting scheme are now "Master Composters". Hazel Saunders and Lesley Greene can help and give encouragement to all kinds of voluntary groups, schools, and individuals to make good compost.
