14. 9 6. **Agree Parish Council response to the following Planning Applications**

a) **S.14/1729/FUL**

Property Address: Land Adj To 3 Broadway The Broadway, Oakridge Lynch, Stroud, Gloucestershire

Description: Erection of a new dwelling.

Decision: 2 **Object**

Reasons / Comments: Reasons

1. The design is not local vernacular, outstandingly new or even low impact. We feel that the Gables appear superfluous, more like eyebrows and it would have looked better to raise the eave height 200mm.
2. The positioning forward of the building line, partially obscures the long distance view of the Old Mill.
3. The splitting of the plot of land from the original house leaves both plots smaller than those of the surrounding houses and makes the new dwelling look out of place.
4. Taking into account the rural setting, the positioning and the direction of the window view might lead to overlooking and privacy issues with the existing house, but it is difficult to avoid this with shape of the site and the forward position of the dwelling. A high fence would be inappropriate.

Boundary change

The local government boundary commission website was checked for the result from the boundary change. (26th August 2014)

They stated: ***the commission has also announced that is it minded to recommend that the district council should have 51 district councillors in the future, the same as at present. The commission now needs information from people and groups across Stroud to help it produce new pattern wards to accommodate those 51 district councillors.***

Please note that the Chief executive is yet to receive a formal letter from the boundary commission on this.

The cross party working group will meet this week to start looking at the ward boundaries.
