This website is run by Bisley-with-Lypiatt Parish Council. We want as many people as possible to be able to use this website. For example, that means you should be able to:

- zoom in up to 200% without the text spilling off the screen
- navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- navigate most of the website using speech recognition software
- listen to most of the website using a screen reader (including the most recent versions of JAWS, NVDA and VoiceOver)

PDFs and other documents

Many of our older PDFs don't meet accessibility standards – for example, they may not be structured so that they are accessible to a screen reader. This doesn't meet WCAG 2.2 success criteria.

Some of our PDFs are essential to providing our services. For example, we have PDFs with information on how users can access our services, and forms published as Word documents. By September 2020, we had either fixed these or replaced them with accessible HTML pages.

The accessibility regulations [don't require us to fix PDFs or other documents published before 23 September 2018](#) if they're not essential to providing our services. For example, we don't plan to fix all minutes and agendas published before January 2018.

Any new PDFs or Word documents we publish will meet accessibility standards.
